Egbert Perry is the Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of The Integral Group, a corporation that specializes in community development and commercial real estate development and investment.

Following the financial crisis of 2008, Perry was asked to join the board of the \$3.2 Trillion financial firm Fannie Mae. After five years, he was appointed chairman of the board, a position he held until the end of 2018. During his tenure, Fannie Mae played a significant part in reviving the \$11 Trillion U.S. housing market, a vital component of the global economy.

Integral, founded in 1993, has around \$2 Billion in completed or ongoing projects. Its portfolio consists of mixed-use, master-planned communities as well as affordable, workforce, and class "A" multifamily housing. Integral has created more than 10,000 housing units, has over \$1.5 billion in its development pipeline, and controls more than 100 acres of urban property for development.

Perry is committed to the community and serves on several local and national boards. He is recognized for creating a holistic community development approach known as "The Atlanta Model." He conceived and then led Integral in collaboration with another private development partner, the company's public-sector partner and the Atlanta Housing Authority, to create a legal, regulatory, and financial model that made mixed-income, mixed-use community developments a strategy.

Perry received both Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees in Civil Engineering from the University of Pennsylvania's Towne School of Engineering, and a Master of Business Administration degree with majors in Finance and Accounting from its Wharton School.
